# EBE103 Biochemistry (2 0 3)

This course includes introduction to biochemistry, water and electrolyte mechanism, proteins, amino acids, enzymes, carbohydrates, lipids, nucleic acids and protein synthesis, hormones, steroid hormones, carbohydrate, lipid and protein metabolism, digestive and absorption biochemistry, vitamin and mineral biochemistry, liver and kidney function tests, test selection and sampling methods.

## EBE207 Emergency Care and First Aid (2 2 4)

It is aimed to have knowledge and skills about first aid in disasters and evaluation and care of the patient in emergency diseases and to apply first aid, to raise awareness of the society, to direct first aid and emergency care and to gain organizational skills. This course; basic decisions and materials related to first aid. emergency care, management and legal aspects, physical diagnosis, determination of priorities, basic and advanced life support, first aid and emergency care in bleeding and shock, infection control, first aid and emergency care in trauma patient, first aid and emergency care in conscious disorders and head trauma, wounds and abscesses, dressings and dressings, fractures, sprains, dislocations, first aid and emergency care in dislocations. Emergency care in painful patients, burns, frostbite, sunstroke, drowning, radioactive material, injury and electric shocks, poisoning, animal bites and stings, foreign body escapes, accidents, disasters, first aid in natural disasters, neurological, cardiovascular and pulmonary emergencies, metabolic, gastrointestinal and environmental emergencies, rescue of accident victims, triage and transportation methods.

This course includes dystocia, anomalies of presentation and position, uterine rupture, multiple pregnancy, umbilical cord anomalies, placenta anomalies, amniotic fluid anomalies (polyhydramnios, oligohydramnios), early rupture of membranes ,

amniotic baby with meconium, amniotic fluid embolism, interventions related to labor, preterm and postterm labor, use of analgesia and anesthesia in labor, application and monitoring of uterotonic agents, systemic diseases and labor, postpartum hemorrhage, birth trauma, injuries and effects, postpartum infections, breast problems and care, urinary system problems and thromboembolic diseases, social support in the postpartum period.
